WASHINGTON-Obama gains a 5pt. lead over McCain, according to the Reuters/C-Span/Zogby poll, Tuesday.

The race front-runner Barack Obama leading with 48%, McCain 43%

"Obama is benefiting from the terrible economic news & poor debate performance by McCain," pollster John Zogby said.

Obama had an increase in the woman's vote, as well as the Hispanic vote. He also leads McCain 10% by independents.

Polls show McCain's numbers slipping.

Voters have more faith in Obama's leadership, than in McCain's, polls show.

This was the second debate for Obama and McCain. The first debate a few weeks ago, claimed Obama winning it slightly ahead of McCain.

Now with this second debate claims Obama victory again, with only 3 weeks away from the election, it increases his likelihood of becoming the next president.

While McCain continually claims he has more experience in politics to be a better choice for being president.

However, it does not erase the facts of Obama's political success. He has achieved more in fewer years, than that of McCain's lengthy political career.

One such result is more new voter registration, first time voters, more than any other time in history.

History has a way of repeating itself. Much like the presidential years of Theodore Roosevelt, and William Taft. Whereas, newcomer Taft, as president got more accomplished in 4 yrs, than did Roosevelt in his nearly double years in politics.

Taft, elected president 1912, brought 90 suits against trusts, Roosevelt, in 1901 stepped in as president, with some 44.

Tues. debate aired live on NBC with Tom Brokov as mediator. The audience participated asking many questions that Americans face today, to both Candidates running for Commander in Chief in this close race.
